History, Economy, and Contributions


Huang He River Valley civilization began ca 2100 BC making it the longe continuous civilization.




# Chinese developed a common currency.



# **Outside Influences**

China wanted to limit contact with the outside world

- Saw their culture as superior & were suspicious of foreigners
- Pretty successful at staying isolated. How?

# **Revolution & Civil War-1940s**

Revolution = Overthrow the government

- Nationalists (Chiang Kai-shek)
- Communists (Chairman Mao Zedong)
- Fought a bitter civil war (conflict between 2 or more groups living in the same country)
  - Nationalists fled the country & founded Taiwan
  - Communists won & founded People's Republic of China

# Characteristics of Communism? \* Government owns businesses

& land and controls all aspects of life

Chairman Mao died in 1976. In 1978, China began a modernization program, loosening Communist controls on the economy & opening up more to the outside world.

2<sup>nd</sup> largest in the world Dollars -GDP = \$9.872Trillion/year of Trillions Friendly Reminder: C GDP = Gross Domesticroduct Value of all the goods & services produced within a country in a single year

# How do the Chinese make Chinese Economy their money?


- Industry-mining, iron & steel manufacturing, clothing, textiles electronics, toys
- Services-banking, insurance, communication, education, health care, transportation, tourism

#### Agriculture


Employs 40% of workers

Only 10% of China is arable

Overall world's largest exporter (20% goes to the U.S.)

#### Slowly transitioning from Command to Market system

Shifting from a system where the government makes all economic decisions to allowing more freedom, prices based on competition and supply & demand instead of what the government says, etc.

1990-Éstablished first Special Economic Zone (SEZ) in Shanghai

Area that has the ability to develop a market economy with no government control of business

#### **Chinese Economy**

SEZs have been established in many more locations around China
 Mostly limited to cities and provinces

along the Pacific

Coast ----Makes sense for shipping out goods

# **Benefits to Setting Up Shop in China**

- Less taxes
- Excellent infrastructure
- Economic freedom from China's command economy
- Greatly reduced tariffs on imports/exports
  Large available workforce
  Low local wages
  Fewer regulations
  Labor laws aren't as strict

# **Outsourcing**-

the shifting of jobs to workers outside of a company, often to a foreign country Usually takes place in countries with emerging (developing) economies such as China & India Commonly outsourced jobs include: **Telecommunications Computer & software companies** Industry




Why is China such a great place for manufacturing?


Huge workforce, cheap labor, lower taxes, fewer regulations on imports/exports, labor laws aren't as strict,

etc.

Fun Facts: China produces 50% of American toys, 66% of the world's bicycles, 42% of all cigarettes

The average factory worker in China makes \$0.92-\$1.36 (USD) an hour.




# **China's People**



### **Culture---Major Religions**

Taoism-stresses living simply and in harmony with nature. Three major beliefs are love, frugality, and non-ambition.


Buddhism-Based on the teaching of Buddha. Believe that moral behavior, kindness, and meditation can lead to peace.

Confucianism-philosophy based on the ideas & teaching of Confucius. Stresses the importance of family, moral values, and respect for one's elders.









# Smog-a haze in the air caused by pollution; mixture of smoke, chemicals, and fog

Causes respiratory illness (colds, asthma, bronchitis, lung infections, etc.), schools cancel outdoor activities, stops air traffic if visibility gets too bad, making its way to other countries (like Japan)

#### Culture---Art

Use lots of bronze, jade, ivory, silk, and porcelain.



#### **Culture---Architecture**

Pagodas-Buddhist temples that have multi-storied towers with an upward curving roof at each floor



## China's roads have the 2nd highest death rates in the world.


- Every day, about 45,000 are injured and 680 people killed (compared to 115 deaths/day in the U.S.).
- Chinese drivers don't use turn signals and see windshield wipers and headlights as distractions.
- The Chinese commonly drink and drive...even during driving school!
